The difference in addition and subtraction word problems lay in their semantic structure. There are three typical ways that subtraction word problems are phrased.

1. Group - This is a part-whole situation (two subsets).

Ex: Jill baked 315 cookies. 59 were vanilla cookies and the rest were chocolate. How many chocolate cookies did she bake?

2. Change - The initial value will change either by increasing or decreasing. Ex: Jill had 654 cookies. She gave 341 cookies to Ann. How many cookies does Jill have now? (Although there are 2 people involved in the word problem, we aren't comparing them)

3. Compare - Two absolute values are compared and there is a relative value.

Ex: Jill has 316 cookies; Ann has 49 cookies more than Jill. How many cookies does Ann have?
